School Sanctioned Events/activities



Teacher Supervised

Coordinated with administration/staff

Supported by the school

School has assumption of **liability**

Must align with school code of conduct

Sanctioned EVENTS

- Grad fundraising (jar/cake walk, sweatshirt sales (part 2), dance show snacks, etc)
- Prom
- Grad Breakfast
- Special Awards Ceremony
- Commencement



Non-Sanctioned EVENTS

Often related to alcohol or unsafe behaviours

- Car Rallies
- House or Field Parties
- Grad Camp-out/Off Campus Coffee House
- Mont Tremblant and other “grad trips”
- Milk Challenge
- Grad “pranks”
- Grad “skip-day”
- Pre-Prom and After Prom

Other Non-Sanctioned Events

Winter Formal

This is NOT school sanctioned (in Quebec, student organized, no staff supervision).

What about Prom?

Prom requires its own separate part in this discussion, both because of the significance of the event and because of the recent changes in how proms can work



Prom - This year

- For reasons of supervision, inclusiveness, and cost, the school will be running Prom again this year. As always, the school does not and will not play a role in pre-prom or after-prom activities
- Our grad committee of students and staff supervisors are already planning Prom on behalf of the entire graduating class - June 14th at the NAC

Role of school/parents

- **School** will continue to actively discourage unsafe activities and communicate with parents when possible
- **Parents** need to be aware of legal liabilities related to hosting activities where alcohol is present
- **Parents** need to be aware of potential dangers of student involvement in non-sanctioned events
- **School and Parents** should ensure students are fully aware of consequences of failure to follow school code of conduct at school sanctioned events

Communication

- **Parents** are asked to have open and frank dialogue with their children about the potential dangers of participation in unsanctioned events, particularly where alcohol/drugs or dangerous behaviour may be a part of the activity
